## A HEAVENLY DAY!!

Have you ever had such a wonderful time doing something that you thought to yourself, "I wish this day would never end." Sometimes at the end of such a day, you might say "What a heavenly day this was."

I was driving around the other day, and the country singer on the radio blurted out the phrase "forever and a day." I think he was probably singing of his love for a certain woman. This is a phrase we often hear and use to indicate a really long period of time.

Now let me tie these two (almost) random thoughts together. The best of days on the earth still have to come to an end. And earthly "forevers" usually do not last that long (i.e. remember saying that you were stuck in the doctor's office "forever"). But in Revelation 21:25 and 22:5, forever is referenced symbolically as a day - an endless day, which for the faithful will be one of comfort, joy, and ultimate bliss.

Imagine being in heaven and feeling so fantastic that you will express, "I'm glad this day will never end." And you know what? It never will. What a wonderful "day" that will be! There will be no death, sorrow, crying, or pain (Revelation 21:4). And that day will go on and on.

Do you have the certainty of being there? If not, dear friend, don't delay, for remember, "*now is the accepted time; behold, now is the day of salvation*" (2 Corinthians 6:2).

*Design Demands A Designer / DNA*

When the psalmist contemplated the living human organism he exclaimed: "I am fearfully and wonderfully made" (Psalm 139:14; cf. 1 Corinthians 12:18).

When one considers just how complex the human body is, it is obvious that there is design in what we see.

For example, Dr. Bert Thompson states, "the human body is composed of multiplied trillions of cells. In the nucleus of each cell, hundreds of thousands of genes are present. Each gene consists of a complex chemical called deoxyribonucleic acid (DNA). DNA has a complicated code for the mapping out of the entire development of the individual. If the coded instructions of a single human cell were put into English," "they would fill a 1,000-volume encyclopedia" (R. Platt, Readers Digest, October, 1962, p 148). It is estimated that the total DNA in a human body would span the solar system (John C. Kendrew, *The Thread of Life*, Harvard University Press, Boston, 1966, p 63). Without this intricately designed process of replication, life could not be passed along with continuity. DNA is the language of life.

As Dr. James Coppedge, a Director of Probability Research in biology states: "By all the rules of reason, could there be a code which carries a message without someone originating that code? It would seem self-evident that any such complex message system, which is seen to be wise and effective, requires not only an intelligence but a person back of it. Who wrote the DNA code? Who is the author of this precise language? There is no evolutionary explanation that even begins to be an adequate answer" (*Evolution, Possible or impossible?*, Zondervan, Grand Rapids, Michigan, 1973, p 138).

In discussing the complexity of the DNA function, evolutionist C.P. Haskins notes that "the most sweeping evolutionary questions at the level of biochemical genetics are still unanswered..." He then concedes that were it not for the evolutionary bias, "this puzzle would have been interpreted as the most powerful sort of evidence for special creation" (C.P. Haskins, *American Scientist*, Vol. 59, May/June, 1971, p305).

Is it possible that the language of life, the DNA which we all possess came into existence by accident? Or is it more probable that this language of life was designed by a Designer? If a 1000 piece jig saw puzzle cannot become complete without the aid of external force, namely man, what does it take to put together the DNA code? It does not seem probable that time and chance could have been the cause, but rather a Designer possessive of a most astounding intelligence.
