"WHY EVANGELISM?"

- 1. Evangelism imitates the work that Jesus did on earth.** The record of Jesus' life shows more individual teaching situations than public.
- 2. Evangelism will seek and save the lost.** As Christians, we should be trying to find the lost.
- 3. Evangelism is one of the commands God has given us.** Remember, the command is to "Go and make disciples" not "Go and make excuses." (**Matthew 28:18-20**).
- 4. Evangelism follows the pattern of the faithful before us.** Paul said, "I kept back nothing that was profitable unto you, but showed you, and have taught you publicly and from house to house."
- 5. Evangelism bears fruit that glorifies God.** Every Christian is to bear fruit for Jesus. He said, "Every branch in me that beareth not fruit, he taketh away; and every branch that beareth fruit, he purgeth it, that it may bear more fruit." (**John 15:2**).
- 6. Evangelism helps us all to appreciate the power of the Gospel more and more.** The more we become involved in evangelism, the more we see the Scriptures applied personally to increase our own faith in the gospel.
- 7. Evangelism develops enthusiasm in the workers.** The more involved each of us are in the work the Lord has given us, the more enthusiastic we become.
- 8. Evangelism helps us appreciate the spiritual blessings we enjoy in Christ.** These spiritual blessings help the worker to have renewed appreciation for the blessings God gives us.

How Then Shall We Live?

Part 2

Years ago Bob Dylan wrote the song “You’ve Gotta Serve Somebody.” In this song he explains that it doesn’t matter who you are, you will yield to some authority. How true this message is. Even the most powerful man in our nation is subject to this principle.

For the most part people choose to obey whatever authority best suits their needs. They will live their lives in such a manner as to comply with that authority.

Likewise, those who are Christians have also chosen to yield to an authority. That authority is God. Some would ask, why do Christians subject themselves to God’s authority?

First, Christians believe that God does exist and that He is the creator of all things, (Genesis 1:1ff; John 1:1-3). Being the Creator He has authority over us. He is our Lord and Master.

Secondly, Christians believe that God has a plan for His creation. This plan involves mankind following His will. As Joshua states, “*And if it is disagreeable in your sight to serve the LORD, choose for yourselves today whom you will serve ... but as for me and my house, we will serve the LORD*” (Josh. 24:15).

To aid us in serving Him God gave us His word so that we might know how we should live. Being physical beings we have difficulties understanding the spiritual realm. “*For {as} the heavens are higher than the earth, So are My ways higher than your ways, And My thoughts than your thoughts,*” (Isa. 55:9). God in His infinite wisdom provided a way for us to understand His will, He had it written down. It is obvious then that God desires us to subject ourselves to His authority. The Bible continually makes reference to us following God’s will, (Eccl. 12:13,14; 2Kgs. 17:13; 1John 5:2).

The Scriptures are clear as to why Christians follow the teachings of the Bible. “*There is a way {which seems} right to a man, But its end is the way of death.*” (Prov. 14:12). “*I know, O LORD, that a man’s way is not in himself; Nor is it in a man who walks to direct his steps*” (Jer. 10:23). Mankind, left to himself, will not come to a proper conclusion in regards to God’s will. If we are to live in the manner that God desires, we must know His will. God provided the means by giving us His written word. It is up to every individual to seek out that will and then live a life that is in compliance.
