WHY BE CONCERNED ABOUT THE MORALS OF OUR NATION?

1. God requires His followers to live soberly, righteously and godly in this world (Titus 2:11-12). We are to bring the LIGHT of Jesus Christ and His way to the world (Matt. 5:16). Followers of God are to rebuke sin and DARKNESS (II Tim. 4:1-4; Eph. 5:11) and call everyone out of sin and darkness (Col. 1:13-14).

2. We are concerned about the world in which our children (and grandchildren) will live! The moral climate is presently deplorable. It appears to be going downhill with each passing day. Though God declares many activities sinful and damning, many often live in whatever way they want. Tragically, they are doing whatever they think is right in their own eyes (Judges 21:25). We must depart from evil, fear the Lord, and be wise as the Lord views wisdom (Prov. 3:7).

3. Christ is the light of the world (John 8:12). He is the only begotten Son of God, the Savior and Redeemer of the world. Followers of Christ are to represent their Savior. We want to help others learn of and come to the light (Col. 1:13-14). Christ is the only Savior who can save us, giving us heaven for eternity. He wants everyone to be saved (I Tim. 2:4). But our Lord has plainly told us that only those who obey Him will be saved (Matt. 7:21).

4. Because we desire a quiet and peaceable life. An immoral climate is a hindrance to a good life.

5. Because we fervently want to go to heaven, along with family and friends. Heaven is a beautiful place. In the Holy Scriptures it is called a mansion (John 14:1-3). Only those who obey God (completely) will get to go to heaven (Matt. 7:21; Heb. 5:8-9). After this life is over, we will face judgment (Heb. 9:27). We want to be God's children, faithfully following Him, and thus know that we will receive heaven (II Tim. 4:6-8). Please give serious consideration to these eternity-determining matters.

So hold your loved ones close today and whisper in their ear. Tell them of your love for them and that you'll always hold them dear. Take the time to always say "I'm sorry," "thank you" or "it's okay". There are some in this community that are saying tomorrow I will change my life. Tomorrow I will go to church. Tomorrow I will call myself a Christian. Tomorrow I will live for God. My friend we do not have tomorrow, all we have is now. The Apostle Paul proclaimed, *“He made Him who knew no sin {to be} sin on our behalf, that we might become the righteousness of God in Him. And working together {with Him,} we also urge you not to receive the grace of God in vain — for He says, AT THE ACCEPTABLE TIME I LISTENED TO YOU, AND ON THE DAY OF SALVATION I HELPED YOU”; behold, now is “THE ACCEPTABLE TIME,” behold, now is “THE DAY OF SALVATION”—* (2 Cor. 5:21-23).
