Reasoning Together

From Discouragement - To Encouragement

Read: 2 Corinthians 1:1-11

Every Christian has or will experience reasons for discouragement. The average Christian is afraid to admit failure and discouragement; he is fearful to admit that maybe he or she is not as optimistic as he should be. I look at the word of God and find a number of men who have gotten discouraged as they served in the work of the Lord.

Discouragement is no respecter of persons. It probably attacks the successful far more than it attacks the unsuccessful. In 11 Corinthians, Paul lets us know it wasn't a respecter in his life. He said he was pressed out of measure above strength, insomuch that he despaired even of life. Paul is saying very plainly that he came to a place where he had just as soon die so he could go on to glory to be with the Lord Jesus Christ.

We need encouragement in times of discouragement. No matter how great our earthly resources, no matter how great a family or how large a family or how wonderful a family; no matter how much recognition—none of those things is an invincible fortress against discouragement. It will visit you! We need to know what to do in times of discouragement. How can we be encouraged in times of discouragement? Paul gives us the answers:

- 1. WHY DOES GOD PERMIT US TO SUFFER? First, God permits us to suffer that we might comfort others. Verse 4 says, "Who comforteth us in all our tribulations, that we may be able to comfort them which are in any trouble, by the comfort wherewith we ourselves are comforted by God. Have you realized that what God is letting you go through is making you a better teacher, a better example, a greater Christian? God allows these trials so you may comfort somebody else.
- **2. MANY TIMES**, God lets us go through suffering, tribulation and trials that we might be a blessing to somebody else. Don't ever get mad at God! Rather, submit and say to Him, "Whatever you're trying to make me, I want to be. Whatever you're trying to teach me, I want to learn. However you're trying to mold me, I want to be pliable."
- **3. THAT WE MIGHT HAVE CONFIDENCE IN HIM ALONE.** Paul said in verse 9, "But we had the sentence of death in ourselves, that we should not trust in ourselves, but in God which raiseth the dead..." Sometimes He allows things to take place so we might trust in Him alone. Paul encourages us by saying in Phil., 4:19, "My God shall supply all your needs according to his riches in glory by Christ Jesus."
