Bind Us Together

In 1977, Bob Gillman wrote a prayer song that calls upon the Lord to bind us together with love. He stresses that there is only one God, one King, one body, and that is why we can sing, "bind us together".

Every time I hear this song my thoughts go to the Lord's Supper. "The cup of blessing which we bless, is it not a participation in the blood of Christ? The bread which we break, is it not a participation in the body of Christ? Because there is one bread, we who are many are one body, for we all partake of the one bread" (I Corinthians 10:16-17).

It's obvious that those who partake of the Lord's Supper are unified and bound together in one spirit. Sharing a common belief, we all partake of the one bread. One person may be leading our prayer of blessing for "the cup," but it is a cup we all bless. We are having table fellowship.

From ancient times the act of eating together has been regarded as a symbol of unity and friendship. And certainly that is true when we meet around the Lord's table. "We who are many are one body, for we all partake of the one bread".

William F. Orr and James Arthur Walther in The Anchor Bible state: "To participate in the Lord's Supper, then, is to be guests of Christ and have table fellowship with him, and thus to accept the benefits of his death and to become one body which actualizes his presence."

REASONING TOGETHER

Elders as Shepherds

Sherman Cannon said, "the work of an elder is more a concern for the souls of men and the leading of an exemplary life before them, than the measure of 'rule' and/or 'authority' one possesses." Those who "shepherd God's flock" (I Peter 5:2) must truly care for the spiritual welfare of the people under their charge.

Shepherds are to know the flock. This requires being out among the sheep. How can a man truly be a shepherd if he doesn't take the time to know the sheep or even where they live? Something is wrong with that picture. Knowing the flock creates a close, loving relationship between shepherds and sheep. It gives overseers insight into how best to do their work and builds trust between sheep and shepherds (cf. I Thessalonians 5:12-15). Knowing the flock enables elders to deal with and solve any problems members have because their needs and struggles are known. Knowing the sheep aids bishops in helping them mature properly and in developing their talents for service to God.

Shepherds are to feed the flock. Elders who know the sheep know what to feed the sheep, a balanced diet of the Word of God. Pastors are involved in this teaching process personally (I Timothy 3:2), encouraging and admonishing (I Thessalonians 5:14), exhorting in the sound doctrine (Titus 1:9). Shepherds help the sheep to know the Good Shepherd (cf. John 10:14).

Shepherds are to guard the flock from evil doers, false teachers, and trouble makers, battling wolves who seek to harm the church of God (Acts 20:28-30). Since they know God's Word, elders silence and refute those who contradict and deceive (Titus 1:9-11). Overseers personally seek sheep gone astray (cf. Luke 15:3-7), sacrificing their time and themselves to rescue and return lost sheep to the Lord, understanding that they themselves "will give an account" to Him (Hebrews 13:17) of their stewardship.

What comfort and security the sheep have, knowing their elders indeed "watch in behalf of [their] souls." These men are a blessing to the church because they are legitimate shepherds.
